We are again pleased to send out informational packets about the **Double Up Food Bucks** program. We ask that you promote this valuable program that provides additional fruits and vegetables to people buying produce with their Bridge Card at area farmers' markets. Since farmers markets will start opening in May, and Double Up Food Bucks (DUFB) starts in June, we are working now to get posters out in the community where people will see them.

Please post the enclosed listings of farmers and community farmers' markets accepting Bridge cards so that this information is available to your constituents. Materials are also available in Spanish. Not sure of what to say if you get questions? Here are some suggested talking points:

Attention, Bridge Card holders: Double Up Food Bucks will be back at your area's farmers' markets starting in June. When you use your Bridge Card at a participating farmers' market, the Double Up Food Bucks program will match you dollar for dollar with bonus funds — up to \$20 — that you can use in the market to buy more fresh, Michigan-grown fruits and vegetables. It's that simple — spend up to \$20 on your Bridge Card at the market, and you'll get up to \$20 more, free, to spend on healthy, local foods. Most farmers' markets and some on-farm produce stands in Allegan, Kent, Ottawa, and Muskegon Counties are participating.
