Millage Proposition Road Resurfacing and Reconstruction Renewal

(This proposal will permit the County to continue its 1.0 mill levy for County Primary Road Resurfacing, Prevention, and related preparation, and City/Village Road Improvement, which expired in 2017. This proposal would renew the 0.9916 mill not reduced by the Headlee Amendment millage rollback, and it would increase that millage by 0.0084 to restore it to its original 1.0 mill.)

Shall the current authorized increase in the millage rate limitation of one mill imposed on all taxable property within the County of Allegan, Michigan, which last resulted in the levy of 0.9916 mills (\$0.9916 of each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for road resurfacing and restoration, be renewed, and shall said millage be increased by 0.0084 mills (\$0.0084 of each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) to offset the millage reduction from one mill as required by law, resulting in a total levy of one mill (\$1.00 of each \$1,000 of taxable valuation), for a period of 6 years, 2018 through 2023, inclusive, for purposes of providing a fund for the resurfacing, preservation, and related preparation of primary roads included in the Allegan County Road System and for reconstruction, resurfacing, and maintenance of major and local streets within the incorporated limits of villages and cities within Allegan County; and shall the County levy such renewal and increase in millage for such purposes, thereby raising in the first year an estimated \$4,454,082.35?

Senior Citizen Services Millage Proposal

Shall the County of Allegan levy 0.493 mills (\$0.493 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of four (4) years, 2018 through 2021, inclusive, for the sole purpose of providing funds for services to senior citizens? If approved and levied, this millage will raise an estimated \$2,284,575 for services to senior citizens in the first calendar year of the levy based on taxable value. This proposal is a renewal of a previously voter authorized millage of 0.436 mills and a new additional millage of 0.057 mills, the revenue from which would be disbursed to the County of Allegan.

Proposal for the Funding of Waste Reduction Programs and for the Collection of Materials for Recycling

To continue and expand solid waste reduction programs under the Allegan County Solid Waste Management Plan, shall Allegan County, pursuant to 1989 PA 138, as amended by 2005 PA 69, impose an annual surcharge on all households in Dorr Township in the amount of \$36 per household per year for a period of five years (2018-2022, inclusive) to cover operational costs of the programs and to be distributed to Allegan County to fund the collection of materials for recycling including, but not limited to, recyclable materials, household hazardous wastes, tires, batteries, and yard clippings, as provided in the Allegan County Solid Waste Management Plan?

Library Millage Proposal

Shall the tax limitation on all taxable property within Dorr Township, Allegan County, Michigan, be increased and the Township be authorized to levy a millage in an amount not to exceed .7980 mill (\$.7980 on each \$1,000 of taxable value), of which .2980 mill is a renewal of the millage rate that expires in 2019 and .50 mill is new additional millage, for ten (10) years, 2020 to 2029 inclusive, to provide funds for operating, maintaining and equipping the Dorr Township Library and for all other library purposes authorized by law? The estimate of the revenue the Township will collect in the first year of levy (2020) if the millage is approved and levied by the Township is approximately \$212,000.

Park Improvement and Maintenance Millage Proposal

Shall Dorr Township increase the tax rate limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution on general ad valorem taxes and levy a new additional millage of .34 mills (\$.34 per \$1,000 of taxable value) on taxable property within Dorr Township for five (5) years, 2018 through 2022, inclusive, to provide funds for the maintenance and improvement of public parks within Dorr Township? If approved and levied, this millage would raise an estimated \$85,328 in the first year of the levy. All or a portion of the revenues from this millage will be disbursed to the Dorr Township Parks Commission or other governmental agency for the maintenance and improvement of public parks within Dorr Township. To the extent required by law, a portion of the revenues from this millage will be captured within the district of and disbursed to the Dorr Township Downtown Development Authority.

Local School District

Hopkins Public Schools Operating Millage Proposal

This proposal will allow the school district to levy the statutory rate of not to exceed 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Hopkins Public Schools, Allegan County, Michigan, be increased by 1.7808 mills (\$1.7808 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 4 years, 2018 to 2021, inclusive, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2018 is approximately \$703,425 (this millage is to restore millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963 and will be levied only to the extent necessary to restore that reduction)?
